### THE CITY:

The event's base will be located in the city of Lonquimay, in the Araucanía Region, a place renowned for its natural beauty, rich Mapuche culture, and outdoor activities. Here, you'll find unique landscapes such as the majestic Lonquimay Volcano, araucaria forests, and trails perfect for ecotourism.

Teams traveling by air should arrive at the Araucanía Airport in Temuco (ZCO).

The organization will provide ground transportation for teams and their luggage arriving at Temuco Airport on March 6 and 7.

It is important to review the products prohibited by Chilean customs, as the country has strict controls on the entry of plant-based and animal products. For more information, visit the SAG website: <https://www.sag.cl/>.

In Lonquimay, you will find small stores and markets where you can stock up on basic food and other necessary items during your stay.

CONSIDER:

The official currency is the Chilean Peso, and it is used everywhere. Very few places accept US dollars, limited to some hotels or travel agencies, but at a very poor exchange rate. Debit and credit cards are widely accepted in most businesses.

Earthquakes are common in Chile, but don't worry—it's a country very well-prepared for seismic activity. Buildings are designed to withstand earthquakes, and the population is well-educated on how to respond to such events.

Chile has one of the best internet connections in Latin America. In cities like Santiago, Valparaíso, and other urban areas, the internet is fast and reliable, with WiFi available in cabins, cafes, and public spaces.


For those traveling to rural or remote areas, access may be more limited, and speeds may be slower. If you need to stay connected during your trip, you can purchase a local SIM card with mobile internet. Chile has good 4G network coverage, especially in cities and along major highways.

Electrical plugs (or adapters for your devices) must be type C or L, which have two round prongs.

The voltage is 220 volts, and the frequency is 50 Hz, so keep this in mind when packing your electronics.

RACE:

The race is scheduled to start on March 9 at 8:00 AM.

The finish is planned for 6:00 PM on Friday, March 14, 2025.

There will be two types of maps: topographic and satellite maps for some sections. Checkpoints (PCs) will be marked on your map. One set of maps will be provided; replacements will not be available if they are damaged or lost. Teams may request an additional set of maps for an associated cost, which must be arranged with the organization in advance.

The checkpoints in the roadbook will be photographs, except for high mountain points, which will have staff present for safety and communication purposes.

There are many clean water sources at mid-altitude along the route. In the high mountain areas, collecting water is almost impossible unless passing by a mountain lagoon. Teams should plan their logistics to carry enough water for these stages.

There are no dangerous animals for humans in Chile. While pumas inhabit the race area, they tend to avoid humans.

There will be a race cutoff point, redirecting teams to the next stage depending on weather conditions or team performance.

Mandatory equipment will follow the ARWS standard. Any modifications will be communicated to registered teams in advance.


EQUIPMENT:

Teams are required to have plastic boxes for transporting their bicycles, adhering to the maximum dimensions specified by ARWS: 1400x800x300mm (no exceptions). This is essential as weather conditions may include rain. The maximum weight for each box is 25 kilograms for delivery during transitions.

The organization will provide two boxes per team for transitions and kayaks.

Kayak Specifications:

- Double kayaks
- No drainage holes
- Integrated seat
- Dimensions: 3.79 m in length, 92 cm in width, 41 cm in height, and 110 cm from footrest to backrest



Each team must bring their own paddles and life jackets. If not, they must inform the organization to coordinate the provision of basic-level paddles and life jackets.

Each team will be responsible for bringing their own water bag to accommodate their paddles, life jackets, and any other items they wish to carry. The maximum weight of the bag at the time of handover to the organization is 25 kilograms.

SCHEDULE:

March 6-7: Reception of international teams at Temuco Airport.

March 7, 8:00 PM: Technical briefing.

March 8: Mandatory equipment check and box delivery.

March 9: Race start.

March 14: Race finish and awards ceremony.

March 15-16: Team transfers to the airport.

It is recommended that return flights be scheduled from 1:00 PM onward, as the journey from Lonquimay to the airport takes approximately 3 hours.
